From the Desk of the Educational Administrator, Daniel Perrotta



Instagram is a photo and video sharing social networking site with millions of users. It is very popular app for teenage girls who love taking selfies. What's the harm if it's only photos? Photos can be of anything, you see a bit of everything on Instagram, from pictures of ice cream sundaes and sunsets to sexual pictures

and images of alcohol and drug use.

While Instagram is quite popular and many use it without incident, there are issues that parents must be aware of and informed about. Kids and teenagers sometimes use Instagram as a way to

circumvent parental restrictions on other social networking sites. Aside from knowing the stated age requirement of thirteen, parents must also know about privacy, content concerns, and cyberbullying on Instagram.

What are the privacy settings? Instagram gives users two options: private or public. Either way, bios are visible to all and can be where predators start looking for underage victims. Instagram states, "All photos are public by default which means they are visible to anyone using Instagram or on the instagram.com website. If you choose to make your account private, then only people who follow you on Instagram will be able to see your photos." The network also states on the public setting, "Anyone signed into the Instagram application can view photos or videos on a public user's Instagram profile. Once you set your posts to private, anyone who wants to see your child's posts will have to send your child a follow request which they can then approve or ignore."

There are other areas that parents need to be aware of. When signing up, the user has the option to include a phone number as part of his public profile. Common sense dictates that posting any phone on an online site is never a smart idea. It is also important to know that Instagram reveals the user's locations. This means that all photographs can be geotagged, revealing the location of the photo using the latitude and longitude. Instagram encourages users to create a Photo Map. While it is possible to turn that off, it's clear that most kids and teenagers don't turn it off, thereby allowing the world to know exactly where they are and where they've been. Even if the privacy settings are set to private, do you know who is following your child? Do your children even know them? Parents need to ask about every follower. If not, there shouldn't be an online relationship or even an Instagram connection with that person. Another reason privacy settings are critical is that there are social groups dedicated to displaying images of minors in sexually suggestive poses that are not technically pornography. Even innocent vacation pictures could appear in a forum for pedophiles.

While Instagram can be harmless if it is properly monitored, it can be used by kids and teenagers to cyberbully their peers. Cyberbullying.us displayed a testimonial from one child in Colorado: "I posted a picture of myself on Instagram and people started commenting these awful things like 'Eww, you are so ugly.', 'Why don't you go kill yourself, everyone would be happier that way.' And I KNOW these people...they go to my school. I cried for a good two hours. But this wasn't the first time this has happened on all my pictures. At least three people say something like that." This is just one reported case of cyberbullying, but there are thousands of cases that go unreported each year.

Parents need to monitor the apps and online sites where their children travel. Know their password, and check their accounts to see what they are posting and who is following them.

Create an Instagram account. Become familiar with the site, and follow your children. Teach them to be aware and to practice online safety.

If you are not watching your children online, someone else will be.



3. Re-Order and Add-on Sheet

After photos are taken, every student will be given a re-order/add-on sheet with a website listed on it, www.virginiareorderphotos.com. The sheet will have an access code where parents can view their child's own individual photo. The re-order prices are slightly higher than the pre-order prices and shipping and handling is not included. These photos will be shipped to the parent's home. You are under no obligation to pre-order pictures, however, you will get a better deal with the pre-ordering option
